GLOSSARY

The following definitions shall apply to and are used in this Request for Qualifications:

"Parking Authority" - refers to the City of New Brunswick Parking Authority.

"Qualification Statement" - refers to the complete responses to this RFQ submitted by the Respondents.

"Qualified Respondent" - refers to those Respondents who (in the sole judgment of the Parking Authority) have satisfied the qualification criteria set forth in this RFQ.

"RFQ" - refers to this Request for Qualifications, including any amendments thereof or supplements thereto.

"Respondent" or "Respondents" - refers to the interested firm(s) that submit a Qualification Statement.

SECTION 1

INTRODUCTION AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1.1. Introduction and Purpose.

The Parking Authority is soliciting Qualification Statements from interested firms that can provide Construction Management Services by an Engineer and/or Architect licensed in the State of New Jersey.

. Through a Request for Qualification process described herein, persons and/or firms interested in assisting the Parking Authority with the provision of such services must prepare and submit a Qualification Statement in accordance with the procedure and schedule in this RFQ. The Parking Authority will review Qualification Statements only from those firms that submit a Qualification Statement which includes all the information required to be included as described herein (in the sole judgment of the Parking Authority). The Parking Authority intends to qualify person(s) and/or firm(s) that (a) possesses the professional, financial and administrative capabilities to provide the proposed services, and (b) will agree to work under the compensation terms and conditions determined by the Parking Authority to provide the greatest benefit to the residents of New Brunswick.

1.2. Procurement Process and Schedule.

The selection of Qualified Respondents is not subject to the provisions of the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-1 et seq. The selection is subject to the "New Jersey Local Unit Pay-to-Play" Law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq., however. The Parking Authority has structured a procurement process that seeks to obtain the desired results described above, while establishing a competitive process to assure that each person and/or firm is provided an equal opportunity to submit a Qualification Statement in response to the RFQ. Qualification Statements will be evaluated in accordance with the criteria set forth in Section 2 of this RFQ, which will be applied in the same manner to each Qualification Statement received.

Qualification Statements will be reviewed and evaluated by the Parking Authority and its legal and/or financial advisors (collectively, the "Review Team"). The Qualification Statements will be reviewed to determine if the Respondent has met the minimum professional, administrative and financial areas described in this

RFQ. Under no circumstances will a member of the review team review responses to an RFQ for a job which they or their firm submitted a response. Based upon the totality of the information contained in the Qualification Statement, including information about the reputation and experience of each Respondent, the Parking Authority will (in its sole judgment) determine which Respondents are qualified (from professional, administrative and financial standpoints) Each Respondent that meets the requirements of the RFQ (in the sole judgment of the Parking Authority) will be designated as a Qualified Respondent and will be given the opportunity to participate in the selection process determined by the Parking Authority.

The RFQ process commences with the issuance of this RFQ. The steps involved in the process and the anticipated completion dates are set forth in Table 1, Procurement Schedule. The Parking Authority reserves the right to, among other things, amend, modify or alter the Procurement Schedule upon notice to all potential Respondents.

All communications concerning this RFQ or the RFQ process shall be directed to the Parking Authority's Designated Contact Person, in writing.

Section 1.3. Conditions Applicable to RFQ.

Upon submission of a Qualification Statement in response to this RFQ, the Respondent acknowledges and consents to the following conditions relative to the submission and review and consideration of its Qualification Statement:

- This document is an RFQ and does not constitute an RFP.
- This RFQ does not commit the Parking Authority to issue an RFP.
- All costs incurred by the Respondent in connection with responding to this RFQ shall be borne solely by the Respondent.
- The Parking Authority reserves the right (in its sole judgment) to reject for any reason any and all responses and components thereof and to eliminate any and all Respondents responding to this RFQ from further consideration for this procurement.

- The Parking Authority reserves the right (in its sole judgment) to reject any Respondent that submits incomplete responses to this RFQ, or a Qualification Statement that is not responsive to the requirements of this RFQ.
- The Parking Authority reserves the right, without prior notice, to supplement, amend, or otherwise modify this RFQ, or otherwise request additional information.
- All Qualification Statements shall become the property of the Parking Authority and will not be returned.
- All Qualification Statements will be made available to the public at the appropriate time, as determined by the Parking Authority (in the exercise of its sole discretion) in accordance with law.
- The Parking Authority may request Respondents to send representatives to the Parking Authority for interviews.
- **Any and all Qualification Statements not received by the Parking Authority by 1:00 p.m. Prevailing Time on June 15, 2017 will be rejected.**
- Neither the Parking Authority, nor their respective staffs, consultants or advisors (including but not limited to the Review Team) shall be liable for any claims or damages resulting from the solicitation or preparation of the Qualification Statement, nor will there be any reimbursement to Respondents for the cost of preparing and submitting a Qualification Statement or for participating in this procurement process.

Section 1.4. Rights of Parking Authority.

The Parking Authority reserves, holds and may exercise, at its sole discretion, the following rights and options with regard to this RFQ and the procurement process in accordance with the provisions of applicable law:

- To determine that any Qualification Statement received complies or fails to comply with the terms of this RFQ.

- To supplement, amend or otherwise modify the RFQ through issuance of addenda to all prospective Respondents who have received a copy of this RFQ.
- To waive any technical non-conformance with the terms of this RFQ.
- To change or alter the schedule for any events called for in this RFQ upon the issuance of notice to all prospective Respondents who have received a copy of this RFQ.
- To conduct investigations of any or all of the Respondents, as the Parking Authority deems necessary or convenient, to clarify the information provided as part of the Qualification Statement and to request additional information to support the information included in any Qualification Statement.
- To suspend or terminate the procurement process described in this RFQ at any time (in its sole discretion.) If terminated, the Parking Authority may determine to commence a new procurement process or exercise any other rights provided under applicable law without any obligation to the Respondents.

The Parking Authority shall be under no obligation to complete all or any portion of the procurement process described in this RFQ.

1.5 Addenda or Amendments to RFQ.

During the period provided for the preparation of responses to the RFQ, the Parking Authority may issue addenda, amendments or answers to written inquiries. Those addenda will be noticed by the Parking Authority and will constitute a part of the RFQ. All responses to the RFQ shall be prepared with full consideration of the addenda issued prior to the proposal submission date.

1.6 Cost of Proposal Preparation.

Each proposal and all information required to be submitted pursuant to the RFQ shall be prepared at the sole cost and expense of the respondent. There shall be no claims whatsoever against the Parking Authority, its staff or consultants for reimbursement for the payment of costs or expenses incurred in the preparation of the Qualification Statement or other information required by the RFQ.

1.7 Proposal Format.

Responses should cover all information requested in the Questions to be answered in this RFQ.

Responses which in the judgment of the Parking Authority fail to meet the requirements of the RFQ or which are in any way conditional, incomplete, obscure, contain additions or deletions from requested information, or contain errors may be rejected.

SECTION 2

SCOPE OF SERVICES

Section 2.0 Background Information

Redevelopment Project

The City of New Brunswick, its redevelopment partner Devco, and several local theatre groups have teamed up to assemble a major downtown redevelopment project that is proposed to include updated and expanded theatre facilities, rehearsal space, 250 market rate and affordable housing units, office space, and a 344-space parking deck.

This 528,000 square foot project (inset rendering) is located in the city's "Cultural Center" district in the central business district and is in close proximity to City Hall and the Middlesex County Courthouse. It is proposed that the 344-space parking deck will be funded, owned and operated by the New Brunswick Parking Authority, a body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey that was created by the City for the purpose of building, maintaining and operating public parking. A portion of the project is proposed to be located on the Cultural Center parking lot, a 48-space surface parking lot that is owned by the New Brunswick Cultural Center and operated by the New Brunswick Parking Authority (NBPA).

Parking Deck Project

Parking deck plans have been prepared by Tim Haahs & Associates, a Pennsylvania based parking garage design firm with offices in New Brunswick, Atlanta and Miami. The proposed precast deck is located on the 48-space parking lot plus a portion of an adjacent TD Bank parking lot. It is our

understanding that TD Bank will have rights to 24 parking spaces located in the parking deck during banking hours. Public parking will begin on the first supported level of the parking deck approximately 23 feet above the sidewalk. This height is required to allow large trucks to pass in and out of the ground level of the parking deck to access loading docks located at the rear of the theatres. In a typical parking deck the height of the first supported parking level is usually about 11½ or 12 feet. The proposed parking deck contains six supported levels and each level has about 59 spaces.

The New Brunswick Parking Authority is seeking qualifications for an Engineer and/or Architect licensed in the State of New Jersey to provide Construction Management services for this project.

Preliminary Parking Deck Project Schedule*

Preconstruction August 1, 2017 – May 31, 2018

Construction June 1, 2018 – May 14, 2019

Closeout May 15, 2019 – June 1, 2019

*subject to adjustment

It is the intent of the Parking Authority to solicit Qualification Statements from Respondents that have expertise in the provision of Construction Management by an Engineer and/or Architect licensed in the State of New Jersey.

Firms and/or persons responding to this RFQ shall be able to demonstrate that they will have the continuing capabilities to perform these services.

The Construction Management ("CM") Firm shall act as the Owner's representative/agent during the Pre- Construction, Construction and Post-Construction phases of the Project. In all instances the CM shall employ its best efforts to protect the interests of the Owner and further the intended goals and purpose of the Project.

SECTION 3

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Section 3.1 General Requirements.

The Qualification Statement submitted by the Respondent must meet or exceed the professional, administrative and financial qualifications set forth in this Section 3 and shall incorporate the information requested below.

In addition to the information required as described below, a Respondent may submit supplemental information that it feels may be useful in evaluating its Qualification Statement. Respondents are encouraged to be clear, factual, and concise in their presentation of information.

Section 3.2 Administrative Information Requirements.

The Respondent shall, as part of its Qualification Statement, provide the following information:

1. An executive summary (not to exceed two (2) pages) of the information contained in all the other parts of the Qualification Statement.
2. An executed Letter of Qualification (See Appendix A to this RFQ).
3. Name, address and telephone number of the firm or firms submitting the Qualification Statement pursuant to this RFQ and the corporate officer authorized to execute agreements, and the name of the key contact person.
4. A description of your firm's history, the business organization (i.e., corporation, partnership, joint venture, etc.) of each firm, its ownership

and its organizational structure, and licenses to do business in the State of New Jersey.

- (a) Provide the names and business addresses of all Principals of the firm or firms submitting the Qualification Statement. For purposes of this RFQ, "Principals" means persons possessing an ownership interest in the Respondent. If the Respondent is a corporation, "Principals" shall include each investor who would have any amount of operational control over the Respondent and every stockholder having an ownership interest of 10% or more in the firm.
 - (b) If a firm is a partially owned or a fully-owned subsidiary of another firm, identify the parent company and describe the nature and extent of the parents' approval rights over the activities of the firm submitting a Qualification Statement. Describe the approval process.
 - (c) If the Respondent is a partnership or a joint venture or similar organization, provide comparable information as required in (b) above for each member of the partnership, joint venture or similar organization.
 - (d) A statement that the Respondent has complied with all applicable affirmative action (or similar) requirements with respect to its business activities, together with evidence of such compliance
5. An executed Letter of Intent (See Appendix B).
 6. The number of years your organization has been in business under the present name.
 7. The number of years the business organization has been under the current management.
 8. A statement that the Respondent is in compliance with all applicable affirmative action (or similar) requirements with respect to its business activities, together with evidence of such compliance (See Exhibit A).

9. Any judgments within the last three years in which Respondent has been adjudicated liable for professional malpractice. If yes, please explain.
10. Whether the business organization is now or has been involved in any bankruptcy or re-organization proceedings in the last ten (10) years. If yes, please explain.
11. Confirm appropriate federal and state licenses to perform activities.

Section 3.3 Professional Information Requirements.

a. Respondent shall submit a description of its overall experience in providing the type of services sought in the RFQ. At a minimum, the following information on past experience should be included as appropriate to the RFQ:

1. Description and scope of work by Respondent
2. Describe in general your firm's regional, statewide, and local service capabilities.
3. Provide a listing of local government clients with which you have similar contracts; include the name, address and telephone number of the contact person.
4. Explanation of perceived relevance of the experience to the RFQ

b. Describe the services that Respondent would perform directly.

c. Describe those portions of the Respondent's services, if any, that are sub-contracted out. Identify all subcontractors the Respondent anticipates using in connection with this project.

d. Resumes – this section shall address areas as outlined here

Provide and identify the names, experience, qualifications, and applicable licenses held by the individual primarily responsible for servicing the New Brunswick Parking Authority and any other person(s), whether as employees or subcontractors, with specialized skills that would be assigned to service the New Brunswick Parking Authority.

Minimum qualification requirements include:

Project Executive should have at least 15 years of management experience with a minimum of three (3) New Jersey public projects of a similar size and scope.

Project Managers should have good communication and computer skills, at least 10 years of management experience on large public construction projects, particularly at least 3 parking structure projects of similar size/scope, and shall have a degree in Architecture or Engineering.

f. A narrative statement of the Respondent's understanding of the Parking Authority's needs and goals.

g. List all immediate relatives of Principal(s) of Respondent who are Parking Authority employees or elected officials of the City. For purposes of the above, "immediate relative" means a spouse, parent, stepparent, brother, sister, child, stepchild, direct-line aunt or uncle, grandparent, grandchild, and in-laws by reason of relation.

h. Provide a statement of assurance to the effect that your firm is not currently in violation of any regulatory rules and regulations that may have an impact on your firm's operations.

i. Provide a statement that your firm will comply with the insurance coverage requirement as set forth in Exhibit B.

Section 3.4 Facilities

This section should address areas as outlined.

a. For your firm's facilities which are located closest to New Brunswick, New Jersey please provide:

1. The location.
2. Firm personnel assigned to this location.
3. The activities of the firm performed at this location.

b. For those facilities and activities located elsewhere, please explain the activities performed elsewhere and why these are best

performed at a different office. Firms where all activities are performed at one location should leave this paragraph blank.

- c. Note, NBPA anticipates providing a small, one person office within their administrative office/trailer for the CM use throughout construction. This office will include internet, phone, copier access, and conference room access for meetings.

Section 3.5 Conflict of Interest

This section should disclose any potential conflicts of interest that the firm may have in performing these services for the New Brunswick Parking Authority.

Qualification Statements forwarded by facsimile or e-mail will not be accepted. Qualification statements received after this time will not be considered. The Parking Authority will not bear responsibility for delays in delivery for any reason.

To be responsive, Qualification Statements must provide all requested information, and must be in strict conformance with the instructions set forth herein. Qualification Statements and all related information must be bound, and signed and acknowledged by the Respondent.

SECTION 5

EVALUATION

The Parking Authority's objective in soliciting Qualification Statements is to enable it to select a firm or organization that will provide high quality and cost effective services to the citizens of New Brunswick. The Parking Authority will consider Qualification Statements only from firms or organizations that, in the Parking Authority's judgment, have demonstrated the capability and willingness to provide high quality services to the citizens of the Parking Authority in the manner described in this RFQ.

Proposals will be evaluated by the Parking Authority on the basis of the most advantageous submission, all relevant factors considered. The evaluation will consider:

1. Experience and reputation in the field;
2. Knowledge of Public / Private projects and the subject matter addressed;
3. Availability to accommodate the required project meetings; and
4. Demonstration of prior experience working on projects involving multiple owners.
5. Proximity of main office to project site.
6. Other factors demonstrated to be in the best interest of the Parking Authority.

Such equal employment opportunity shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Public Agency Compliance Officer setting forth provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex.

The contractor or subcontractor will send to each labor union, with which it has a collective bargaining agreement, a notice, to be provided by the agency contracting officer, advising the labor union of the contractor's commitments under this chapter and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The contractor or subcontractor, where applicable, agrees to comply with any regulations promulgated by the Treasurer pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq., as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to make good faith efforts to meet targeted

county employment goals established in accordance with N.J.A.C. 17:27-5.2.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to inform in writing its appropriate recruitment agencies including, but not limited to, employment agencies, placement bureaus, colleges, universities, and labor unions, that it does not discriminate on the basis of age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, and that it will discontinue the use of any recruitment agency which engages in direct or indirect discriminatory practices.

The contractor or subcontractor agrees to revise any of its testing procedures, if necessary, to assure that all personnel testing conforms with the principles of job-related testing, as established by the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey and as established by applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

In conforming with the targeted employment goals, the contractor or subcontractor agrees to review all procedures relating to transfer, upgrading, downgrading and layoff to ensure that all such actions are taken without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, affectional or sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, disability, nationality or sex, consistent with the statutes and court decisions of the State of New Jersey, and applicable Federal law and applicable Federal court decisions.

The contractor shall submit to the public agency, after notification of award but prior to execution of a goods and services contract, one of the following three documents:

Letter of Federal Affirmative Action Plan Approval

Certificate of Employee Information Report

Employee Information Report Form AA302 (electronically provided by the Division and distributed to the public agency through the Division's website at www.state.nj.us/treasury/contract_compliance)

The contractor and its subcontractors shall furnish such reports or other documents to the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance as may be requested by the office from time to time in order to carry out the purposes of these regulations, and public agencies shall furnish such information as may be requested by the Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance for conducting a compliance investigation pursuant to **Subchapter 10 of the Administrative Code at N.J.A.C. 17:27**.

EXHIBIT B
INSURANCE and INDEMNIFICATION

1. INSURANCE

Prior to commencing work under contract or within ten (10) days of the award of Contract, whichever is first, the successful firm(s) shall furnish the NBPA with a certificate of insurance as evidence that it has procured the insurance coverage required herein. This coverage must be provided by a carrier approved by the NBPA and rated appropriately through A.M. Best. Firms must give the NBPA a sixty day notice of cancellation, non-renewal or change in insurance coverage.

The successful firm(s) shall provide and maintain the following minimum limits of insurance coverage during the period of performance required under the contract resulting from this Request For Qualifications:

1.1 PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY

\$1,000,000.00 errors and omissions/malpractice for occurrence.

1.2 WORKERS COMPENSATION AND EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY

Statutory coverage for New Jersey;
\$500,000.00 Employer's Liability;
Broad Form All-States Endorsement.

1.3 GENERAL LIABILITY

\$1,000,000.00 per occurrence/ \$3,000,000.00 aggregate for bodily injury and property damage. The New Brunswick Parking Authority ("NBPA"), Timothy Haahs & Associates, Inc., and their consultants shall be named as additional insured with respect to general liability.

1.4 AUTO LIABILITY

\$1,000,000.00 per occurrence. This coverage is required if the operation of any vehicle is required in the performance of the services detailed herein (including but not limited to the use of a vehicle to make any on-site visits).

2. **INDEMNIFICATION**

The contractor shall assume all risk of and responsibility for, and agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless the NBPA and their consultants, and the City of New Brunswick and their respective officials and employees from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, recoveries, judgments and costs and expenses in connection therewith on account of the loss of life, property or injury or damage to the person, body or property of any person or persons whatsoever, which shall arise from or result directly or indirectly from the work and/or materials supplied under this contract. This indemnification obligation is not limited by, but is in addition to the insurance obligations contained in this agreement.
